Hackney Mayoral Election

On **Thursday 5 May 2022**, electors in Hackney will have the opportunity to vote for the person they want to be Mayor of Hackney until 2026.

The elected Mayor leads the Council and its full range of services. It is different to a ceremonial Mayor; in Hackney this role is carried out by the Speaker of Hackney.

This booklet must be sent to you by law¹. It is produced by Mark Carroll, the Returning Officer, and contains an election address – or statement – from all of those candidates for Mayor who chose to be included. The content is the responsibility of the candidates themselves, provided they comply with legal requirements, and the views expressed are theirs'. Their names and details appear in random order, which is determined by drawing lots.

This booklet also includes information on how to vote.

Scrap the Mayoral system which puts all the decision-making in the hands of one person. Give back power to the local councillors who are more approachable.



Young people must be the priority – the council needs to run its own apprenticeship schemes for school leavers and employ staff directly to run council services – stop the contracting out to developers and multi-national corporations: Local jobs for local people.

More resources for youth clubs to ensure that youngsters have positive experiences rather than being alienated and drifting into drugs, alcohol, gangs and violence.

More council run under-5s playgroups which benefit the toddlers but more importantly, the parents, who learn good parenting skills from each other and are less isolated.

Climate Change: Take effective measures to combat climate change by making insulation of our homes a priority, cutting rising energy bills AND saving the planet. Hackney's target of becoming carbon neutral by 2040 is way behind other London boroughs such as Lewisham. Blocking roads just increases the pollution elsewhere.

Voter information

Every registered elector receives a poll card which explains when, where and how to vote.



For details of your polling station, you can also visit www.hackney.gov.uk/elections

Who can vote?

To vote in this election, your name must be included on the Register of Electors for Hackney. All registered British, Commonwealth, Irish and European Union citizens are entitled to vote. British overseas electors are not entitled to vote. All voters must be 18 years of age on or before 5 May 2022.

Postal voters

If you have registered for a postal vote, a pack will be posted to the address you requested arriving from 22 April 2022. If you have not received it by 29 April 2022, please email **electoralservices@hackney.gov.uk** or call **020 8356 3232**.

Please ensure your completed ballot is received by the Returning Officer before 10pm on 5 May 2022. If you forget to post it, you can drop it in at a polling station on the day of the election.

Proxy voters

You can appoint someone else to cast your vote on your behalf if you wish. Proxy voter applications must be received by the Council by 5pm on 26 April 2022.

Emergency proxy voters

If you are unexpectedly taken ill or are suddenly called away for work purposes after 5pm on 26 April 2022 and cannot go to vote in person you can appoint an emergency proxy to vote for you. You will have to give a reason why you cannot vote in person and your application must be supported by a doctor or your employer. To apply for a proxy vote visit **www.hackney.gov.uk/ways-to-vote** or call **020 8356 3232**.

How is the Mayor elected?

The count will take place on 6 May 2022. The Mayor is elected using the supplementary voting system. You will have two votes — one for your first choice candidate and one for your second choice. To vote for your first choice, mark a cross in the first choice column. To vote for your second choice, mark a cross in the second choice column. You do not have to mark a second choice if you do not want to. If you vote for the same candidate twice, your second vote will not be counted.

If, when all the first choice votes are counted, one candidate has received more than 50% of the votes, they will be elected the Mayor of Hackney. If no candidate has more than 50% of the votes, the two candidates with the most first choice votes will remain in the election and all the other candidates will be eliminated.

The ballot papers for all the eliminated candidates will then be counted, with the second choice votes for the two remaining candidates added to their first round totals. The candidate with the most votes overall is then elected Mayor of Hackney.
